Another week has whizzed by and it was lovely for it to be calmer for the students with less interruptions than the week before. The gloss of return after lockdown has



worn off a little and there have been some niggles creeping in. The junior and middle children met together to create the expectations around sandpit use. They have displayed a poster by the sandpit and there are lots of extra check ins as they learn sharing does not mean someone has to give them something, they may have to wait 😊

Karen Phelps and I spent Tuesday refocusing on our PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) work. In the week before lockdown staff had a very enlightening day being introduced to PB4L schoolwide. What's important to note is that PB4L is not an overnight 'quick fix' (if only there was such a thing). It is an ongoing behavioural approach which will take time to implement. At this stage we continue to manage behaviour using our current systems, and then as we learn more we will make adaptations. This approach shifts from a punitive approach for some students to a relational approach for all. We want all of our students to do the right thing and we have to ensure as a school and community we know what values we expect, we need to teach these to the children and acknowledge those who do, while helping those who do not (including with consequences).



As we moved to level one last week, we took the time to decide what we do and do not want to keep going. While we could relax all the rules, there are many good practises that we want to continue. On the next page I have outlined what we will do until the end of term.

This week our senior class continues to plan the art exhibition for the 1<sup>st</sup> July. As event managers they have formed committees for decorations, display, catering and music. Their enthusiasm is awesome and this enables them to use elements of both food technology and design, as well as exhibiting their work this

term. All classes will be continuing their art focus this week and the results are already amazing... we can't wait to share them with you in a few weeks.
