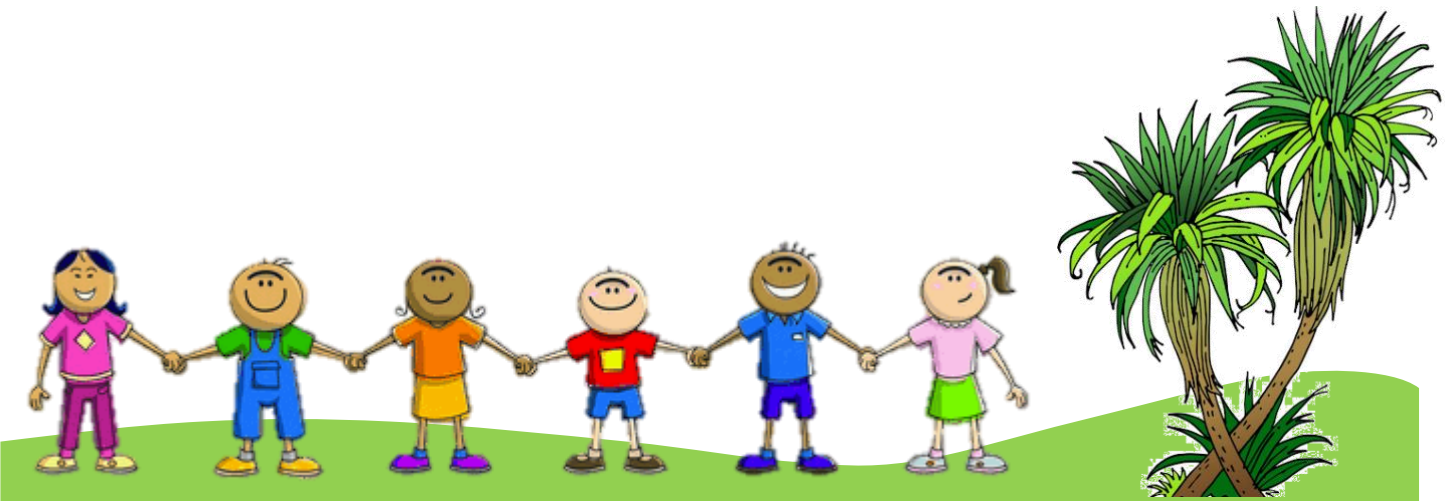

Food and drink will be available for purchase.

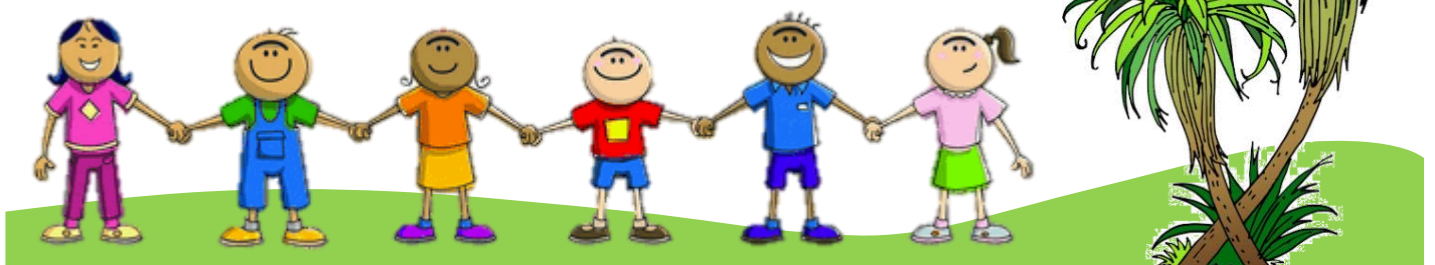
ASSEMBLY

COLLECTING YOUR CHILD FROM SCHOOL

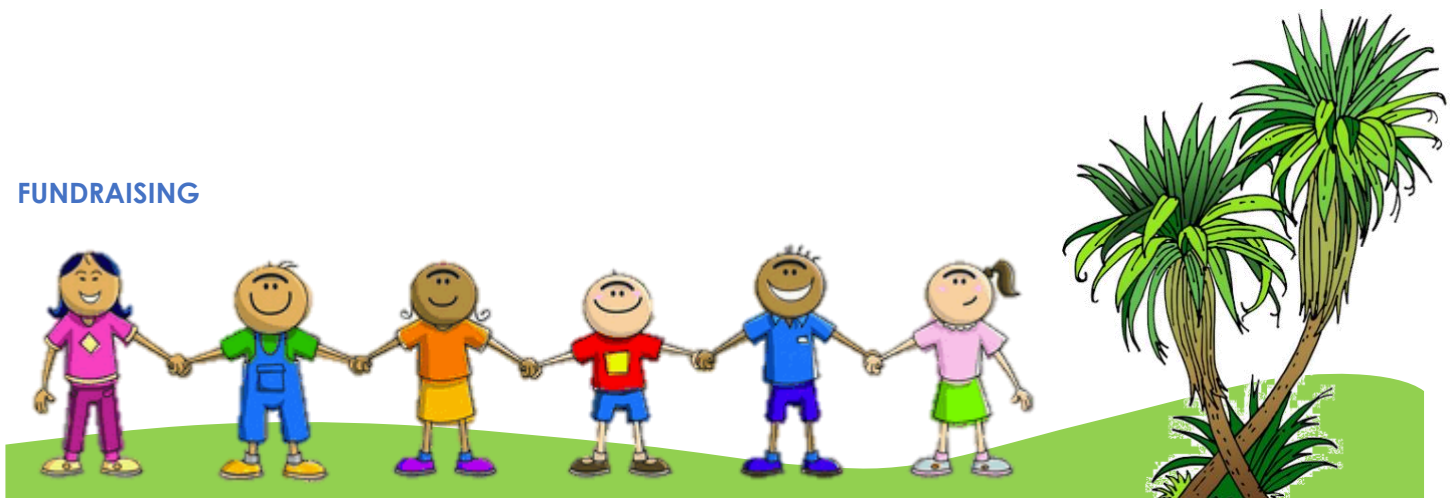
Reminder: Please when you are picking your children up from school you **MUST** have your child ticked off the car or bus line. The bus monitor must see that it is you **IN PERSON** collecting your child.

If your child is being collected from a relative or a friend (no matter if we know that person or not) they must also meet the monitor in person.

Children are not allowed to run across the grass to meet the adult halfway. Adults must come to the car and bus lines in front of the classrooms.

When arriving to collect your child early during school time for swimming etc please **go to the office first and sign in** rather than going directly to your child's class.

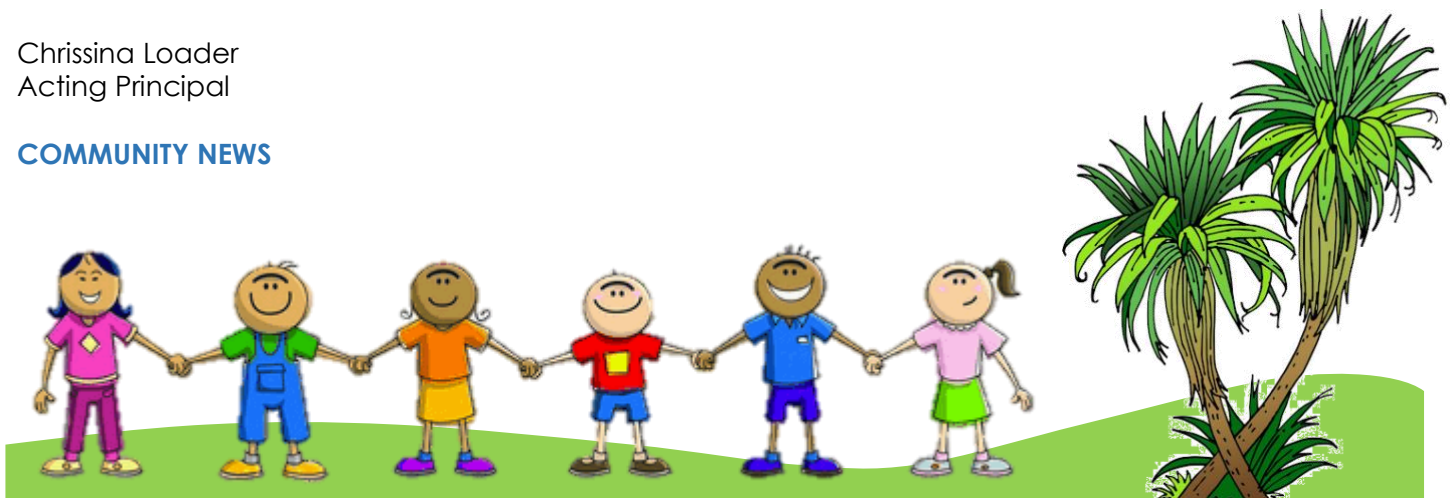
